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## 3 Billion mobile subscribers in 2010

Wednesday April 20, 2005 -- Gartner presented its views on how wireless will become an indispensable business tool to reduce costs, drive revenue and enable new business opportunities at its two-day Wireless and Mobile Summit in London to over 450 European senior IT and mobile decision makers and professionals.

It said convergence and bundling of services as well as Asia / Pacific domination of subscriber growth will be the prevalent trends in the mobile and wireless industry over the next five years. Gartner also predicted that long-term, mobile operators will face an uncertain future, threatened by third party portals, IT outsourcers, and new technologies such as WiMax and DVB.

Gartner estimates there will be three billion mobile subscribers in the world by 2010, a doubling of current subscriber levels.

The largest proportion of growth will come from the Asia/Pacific region, whose subscriber base will characteristically have lower incomes and demand cheaper handsets. Gartner predicts that by 2009, 20 percent of enterprise buyers will source fixed mobile convergence instead of buying communications services separately. This presents an opportunity to save money, but also a risk because this may not provide best of breed for all services.
